





Dyno Day at Schings Racing, by Larry Woods

It was just a normal Saturday morning. You know one of those days when you have three of the most renown car marques looking for bragging rights. Let me see, there were six BMWs, seven Porsches and two Corvettes sitting in the parking lot. Although only the brave of heart would step up to defend their marque!

The rules were simple. Put your car on the chassis dyno and let Greg Schings run it up to whatever redline you picked. Then look and see what the MPH, air to fuel mixture looked like and look at the rear end horse power to see what the beast was putting out. The lowest RPM selected was 7000 RPM.



Being the good host that we were, we let the Bluegrass BMW club go first. They had brought a automatic everyday driver, an M3, an M5 and a race car. It was interesting to see what rear end horsepower the different models would put out. If




to see what rear end horsepower the different models would put out. If memory serves me the highest they achieved was 300 on the M5. Then the Porsches ran. The first car up was a red European 930. The owner nor any of the participants could figure out how to turn the ABS off. Darn cars are too smart for their own good. So, it will have to come back another day. Let's see, oh yes the Corvettes. We were all looking forward to the running of a particular yellow

Corvette with alcohol injection but, alas it arrived DOA in the parking lot. It seems its damper pulley came apart. We did have a black Corvette that turned out consistently 265 horsepower at the rear wheels.

After all of this fun it made us thirsty so we adjourned to Applebee's with some new friends and some old ones to partake of a little refreshment and reflect on the day. If you missed it, you missed a really good time.


